Comments & Feedback

Jim Holmberg - "U" shape without the cabinet in the middle because there will be only 1 bartender 99% of the time and it will be a pain to work around it with the bottles spread throughout.

Sam Dale - I like to be able to converse with others at the bar and the 'U' shape is better for that.

Jay Madsen - I go for U-shaped no question. Put the display at open end of the U; No overhead racks. U-shaped is better for socializing. Big groups are composed of small groups(at tables) anyway.

Drew Niedringhaus - The U shaped bar seems better to me - SDYC has a straight bar and SWYC has a U shaped bar. The U shaped bar at SWYC is more conducive to cross bar communication and bartender access. When you enter, you can "sweep the bar" with your eyes and see who's there and where there is a seat. Works well.

James Gilmore - To be honest what it looks like matters less to me than what it serves: Guinness please!

Frank Gazzano - Can you please attach JPEGs of the two configurations and their location within the lounge area in order to provide an informed answer?

Committee Feedback - "U" shape is shown in current plans (on SGYC website & in Club office) We didn't want to incur additional architect costs to draft "L" shape bar unless there is enough member interest.

Fred Wieder - I think which ever bar shape is utilized it should be against an inside wall as are the SDYC and SWYC bars. An outside wall blocks view and subjects the contents of the bar to Sun heat. From my experience as a builder in Florida it is much easier to control the temperature of stored wines and beers in storage rooms against inside walls than outside walls. Our wines are all "burned" from the heat in our dumb storage shed and the dumb dark box on the back of our current bar. And, the bartenders are always complaining of the heat behind our current bar.

Harold O'Neal - Are there any cost differences between L shaped and U shaped?

Committee Feedback - We didn't want to incur additional architect costs to draft "L" shape bar unless there is enough member interest.

Bob Carlston - I prefer the "U" shaped bar. It will be more efficient for serving cocktails.
